The National Skills Authority (NSA) wants to recommend Companies and Organisations of all sizes that have embedded good practices in skills development in their organisations for recognition by the Minister of Labour.

Application phase

Applications must be sent/forwarded to the relevant Sector Education and Training Authority (SETA) or Department of Labour’s, Provincial Offices or Labour Centres.

- SETAs’ statutory bodies not aligned to a SETA will submit to the Department’s Head Office
- Public sector, provincial government departments will submit to provinces or via the PSETA
- Non-levy payers, CBOs and NGOs will submit to the SETA with which they are associated or to the Department of Labour’s provincial offices.

Selection for nominees will be in two phases.

The first selection phase will be at the SETAs and provincial offices of the Department of Labour.

The SETA and Provincial Adjudication Panels of the Department will select/nominate in terms of their set criteria and make recommendations to a National Skills Authority Adjudication Panel.

The second and final selection phase will be done by the NSA Adjudication Panel.

The National Awards Ceremony of Good Practice in Skills Development will be held during the occasion of the National Skills Development Conference on 17 October 2008.

Application forms for completion to participate will be accessible at all SETAs and Provincial Offices/Labour Centres or can be downloaded from the Website: www.labour.gov.za.

Completed application forms must be submitted to the relevant SETA or Provincial Office of the Department by no later than Friday, 29 August 2008.
