

- ➤Non compliances noted, notices have been served







- National blitz & 871 inspections conducted
- Parameters for the blitz:
 - √ Range: # of employees
 - o > 10
 - 11 99
 - o 100 500
 - 501 and more
 - ✓ Risk assessment
 - HBA, Ergonomics (physical, cognitive & organizational) factors), HCA, illumination, IAQ/ ventilation & type of ventilation, list indoor air quality parameters assessed


- Parameters for the blitz:
 - ✓ Working hours
 - ✓ Exposure monitoring
 - ✓ Medical surveillance
 - ✓ Information, Instruction and training of workers
 - √ Maintenance plan
 - Ventilation control measures & RHCA control measures
 - Light fittings
 - ✓ Emergency lighting and testing of emergency lights
 - Certificate of compliance for electrical installation
 - Reporting of incidents and occupational diseases

































- Employers involved in telework seem to overlook hazards employees may be exposed to
- OHS Act, Act 85 of 1993 defines a workplace as "any premises or place where a person performs work in the course of their employment".
- Section 8 of the requires employers to establishing hazards and precautionary measures attached to any work





- Exposure to a hazard resulting from the digital economy should be mitigated to the lowest reasonably practicable level by implementing a progressive combination of the hierarchy of controls.
- The hierarchy of controls is a step-by-step approach to eliminate or mitigate workplace hazards. It ranks controls from the most effective level of protection to the least effective level of protection.





When choosing a control method:

✓ Assess the feasibility of the first layer of controls (elimination) before moving on to the second layer (substitution)

✓ All relevant controls should and implemented






- When choosing a control method:
 - ✓ Additional control measures by the employer should implement include, but not limited to:
 - Providing supervisors with training on effective risk management,
 - Distance leadership and workplace health and safety promotion.





Hierarchy of controls of occupational hazards in the digital economy







- ➤ Additional control measures by the employer should implement include, but not limited to:
 - Providing supervisors with training on effective risk management,
 - ➤ Distance leadership and workplace health and safety promotion. This training should cover how to mitigate risk and respond to employees' health and safety issues.
 - providing employees with: information, recommendations and training on how to setup and adjust workstations;
 - ➤ clear communication on tasks, responsibilities, decisionmaking authority, autonomy and results to be achieved, adjusting workload and work assignments where necessary;
 - defined, regular working hours and rest periods; and o
 - > clear direction on maintaining confidential information.

Conclusion

- The sampled employers low compliance and indicated a need for:
 - ✓ In depth advocacy and inspections
 - ✓ Addressing OHS mattes in the digital era through:
 - ✓ Gap analysis: research and legislative review,
 - √ Implementation of OHS programmes
 - ✓ Training programmes, and
 - ✓ Collaborative efforts (all social partners and experts)
